Natural History (M) The trip takes you through the Wilderness estuaries of Cape Romain National Wildlife Refuge for a guided exploration of Bulls Island. Explore the barrier island, from the salt marsh flats through maritime forest, past fresh water ponds to the beach. The birds of the estuary give way to woodland species and then transition to the wading birds in the impoundments and finally to the pelagic species of the open Atlantic. Glimpse the barrier island processes that include geological morphology, flora and fauna identification, human history and other surprises along the way. Trip highlights include Atlantic Bottle Nosed Dolphins, American Oystercatchers, American Alligators, and Bone Yard Beach. A moderate amount of walking is required.

Birding (E) Ion Swamp and Willow Hall Roads, Francis Marion NF. An easy walk along level forest service roads to look for wintering and early breeding birds on the Southern Forest. Targets will include Redcockaded Woodpecker, Bachman's Sparrow and Brown-headed Nuthatch in the Long-leaf Pine Forest and N. Parula, Yellow-throated Warblers, White-eyed Vireos and various woodpeckers and passerines in the lowland swamps. Mississippi and Swallow-tailed Kites are possible. We will also be on the lookout for early season butterflies like Henry's, Eastern Pine Elfin and Falcated Orangetips.
